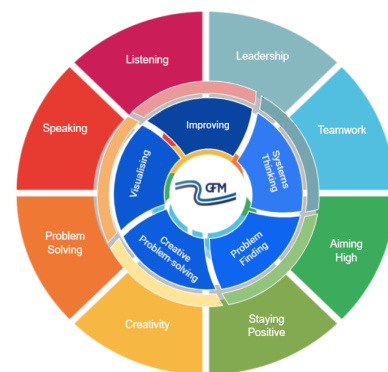

**ATTENDANCE MATTERS** and your child benefits from being in school. Please note that every application for a leave of absence is reviewed on a case by case basis. If the GFM has a concern about your child's attendance you may be required to attend a GFM Attendance Panel to discuss this. This Panel is an opportunity for enquiry where there may be questions over attendance and is an opportunity for discussion.

**CAR PARKING** on site is for staff members, those dropping to GClub (please ensure your child is chaperoned through the car park) or for families with permission (they will have a permit). If accessing the car park for authorised purposes, please do so at a sensible speed. To ensure the car park is used correctly, after half-term, it **is not** going to be open at drop off or pick up times. We are returning to our pre-Covid exit plan of the community needing to exit via the Bury Hall Lane Gate, Pyrford Close red gate or the wooden Ladram Road gate. If you have permission to use the school car park gate, you will need to open it yourself and ensure it is closed behind you. If you have forgotten the code please speak to someone in the school office.

**CLEAN AIR DAY 2022** On Thursday 16 June, Gomer Junior School will be taking part in Clean Air Day. Pupils are encouraged to walk, scooter or cycle to school. During the day, adults and children will be taking part in a variety of activities. So, why not leave the car at home, Gomer?

**MUSIC LESSONS** continue to be well received in school. The cost of music lessons is currently £70 per term and is calculated on pupils receiving approximately 10 lessons during the term (sometimes more) which works out at approximately £7.00 per lesson which is superb value. **OFF-SITE VISITS and RESIDENTIALS**, now that COVID restrictions have been lifted, are making a more consistent return in the next academic year. Without contributions to the visits they just would not be possible. Coach travel is costly. We do try to make visits as competitively priced as possible.
