KING CHARLES CORONATION CELEBRATION DAY is all set for Friday 5 May. With thanks to those who have purchased a Gomer Coronation tea towel. This will make for a super memento and should be with you before the Coronation Weekend. The FROGJS have purchased a commemorative badge for each child to have as a memento of this special occasion. Please send your child to school in red, white and blue clothing (there will be no PE on this day) and singing lessons for this week will take place on Thursday 4 May. GFM Catering has provided a picnic menu for that day, so children can have a picnic lunch/garden party outside if the weather is fine - thank you to those who have ordered (no further orders can now be taken). Children are welcome to bring a named picnic blanket should they wish to. They will also have the opportunity to sit with Gomer Infant School in order that all children eat together.

At 1:45pm on this day, the Pyrford gate will be open and families are then invited to join us to watch the children from across the Gomer Community perform songs across the decades of King Charles' life - Performance will begin at 2:00pm. Please enter the school site via the Pyrford Road or Ladram Road Gate. You will be directed from these entrances to a performance area. Please be aware that weather permitting, we will be on the field. Please bring picnic blankets or your own seating if required. FROGJS will have light refreshments available for you to buy from the playground or you may like to bring your own (no alcohol please). SATs have been scheduled, for the second year since COVID, for Year 6 by the government. We were pleased so many families attended our SATs Information Session in March. The school is committed to ensuring pupils make progress throughout their learning journey at Gomer and can account for this accordingly. We will share attainment information with parents/carers in our annual reports (July) and liaise closely with secondary schools to inform them about Year 6 accordingly. Year 6 children are invited to arrive at school each day from 8.20am for a SATs breakfast. They should arrive at The Globe where they will be provided with a drink and light snack e.g. cereal or toast. They are encouraged to also have a pre-breakfast before they arrive, so they have plenty of energy.

How you can help your child with the build up to and during SATs week:

- Plan a relaxing weekend before the SATS perfect due to the Coronation extended weekend
- Ensure your child gets plenty of sleep during SATs week
- Talk to your child about how they are feeling
- Find small things that can help your child relax during the week
- Make sure they are in school with plenty of time rushing can add to feeling unsettled
- Remind them that they are awesome and SATs are only a snapshot of who they are

SEND PARENT DROP IN this half term will focus on 'Strategies to support Speech, Language and Communication Needs'. These are free to attend and are held at The GFM Community Hub, which is located on the Brune Park School site. The next session is going to be held between 4pm and 5pm on Tuesday 23 May, parking is available on site. You are welcome to turn up on the day - no booking is required. The session usually includes an information presentation from our GFM SEND Leaders plus local professionals, then an opportunity for you to share and ask questions. Handouts and refreshments are provided free of charge.

On arrival to school, please make your way to the school hall by the picnic area door (5 minutes ahead of your child's sitting) so we can have you signed-in and seated ahead of your child joining you. You will be required to wear a visitors sticker and asked to hand this in when you leave so we can account for you being off-site.

Please note that meal choices CANNOT BE CHANGED on the day once ordered. If you are unable to attend, you may like to organise a friend or relative to sit with your child. Once you and your child have eaten, you are encouraged to stay and play outside if the weather is fine and you have time. If we experience a wet play, we may have to ask 'Special Men' to leave after you have eaten due to limited space inside the school.

STAFF MATTER and we are delighted to inform you that Mrs Thurston is pregnant. Due to the due date of the baby, Mrs Thurston will be with her class until the end of the academic year. Team Gomer are very excited for Mrs Thurston and their family. We welcome back Mrs Wilden, from her maternity leave, at the end of the month. She will be working on a Monday, Tuesday and Friday for the remainder of the term - in her Assistant Headteacher role, supporting our Inclusion work across the school and providing some class based teaching where required. We are delighted that Miss Annison, who has been covering Mrs Wilden's leave, will remain with Team Gomer.

SUMMER UNIFORM is welcome this term and until October half-term. Summer uniform includes:

- Royal Blue jumper/cardigan or Team Gomer sports jacket.
- White polo type shirt with a collar or a white cotton shirt with a stiff collar.
- For boys: Grey or black trousers or shorts and short white, grey or black socks.
- **For girls:** Grey or black trousers, shorts or culottes or dark/**navy blue** gingham dresses, or playsuits or gingham blouse and skirt to be worn as a two piece, long or short white, grey or black socks.
- Sensible black shoes (no trainers unless all black and shoe like) or sensible/supportive black or white sandals and trainers for PE days.
- Sensible lightweight coat.

SWIMMING for Year 4 is underway this term. 4LW will continue their sessions at Brune Park. 4IA will start in June. Please ensure the children have their swim kits (one-piece swimsuit for girls) in school plus a small snack and drink for after.

THE SUN IS SHINING and children thoroughly enjoy being outside. To help keep them safe in the sun, please remember sun safety messages: 'slip, slop, slap'. Sun safety experts recommend:

- **Slip** on sun protective, pale clothing that covers as much of your body as possible.
- **Slop** on SPF 30 or higher broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen, at least 20 minutes before sun exposure.
- **Slap** on a sun hat that shades your face, neck and ears. We do not mind what colour this however, Gomer blue would be amazing just like Mr Guest's hat!

We have been made aware that some Nivea sun creams now contain almond oil and we do have some pupils in school with nut allergies - please bear this in mind when applying sunscreen for school - thank you.

Please help us to keep your children safe in the sun. And, please see our washing instructions below for any suncream related stains.



TEACHERS Information about the teachers your child will be learning with next year in Gomer Junior, will be shared in July, before transition. In July there are opportunities planned for your child to meet and work with their new teacher(s) and support staff, whilst learning a little about what life will be like in the new year group. If you feel that your child requires additional support to transition into their next year group, please make contact with their current class teacher or Learning Mentor (LAPS) to arrange this.

TRANSITION MATTERS and is a major event not only for a young person but also for the family members that support their child. It is therefore our aim to ensure that the transition journey is reassuring, informative and exciting. A move to a new school is a significant time for any family. For some, transition will be an exciting time. For others, this will be a time of nervousness. Our Year 2s will receive a warm welcome and opportunities to learn more about us, our approach and have opportunities to preview KS2 learning during the Summer Term. Our Year 6 will also be supported by us here at Gomer and their new schools after the May half term through a variety of activities. Transition days are planned for all year groups on July 13 and 14; more details will follow nearer the time. Parents/carers of children in year 2 or 6 who require additional transition support, will be contacted individually.

YOU SAID/WE DID We have been informed that some families find it difficult to remove sunscreen stains from the white polo tops. In brief, there is not a 'blue' polo top option - Gomer has always been white and we are not intending to change our uniform policy. Part of the reason for this choice is due to the white tops being readily available and at a competitive price. For example, polo tops from Asda cost £2.50 for 2 or £6.00 for 5. Additionally, the Skoolkit website is misleading - we have told them that the image looks blue (the description outlines white) - sorry for the confusion. To help you, we have learned that the higher the SPF the increased chances there are of staining. Might a lower SPF, be just as efficient, with the addition of a sun hat 'legionnaire' style to cover the neck? Eucerin 50+ sunscreen claims not to stain clothes so it is worth shopping around. Additionally, you may wish to try these methods to remove a yellow sunscreen stain:

- Do a pre-treatment before washing. Rub a specific laundry detergent designed for stains into the mark and leave for 10 minutes before rinsing and washing.
- After washing, hang your white clothing out in the sun to dry. The sun naturally bleaches stained white clothing in a safe way. For stubborn stains, use lemon juice to intensify the bleaching results.
- Soak the stain in white vinegar. Follow this by washing on a hot temperature.
- Use eucalyptus oil. Cover the stain and leave for five minutes before washing as normal.
