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**CHRISTMAS LUNCH** We will be having our Christmas Lunch on Wednesday 13 December. Children can choose from a traditional Roast Turkey Lunch (Red) or a Quorn Roast (Green), together with all trimmings and pudding. Children are encouraged to wear Christmas or festive coloured jumpers, with their school uniform, for the Christmas meal.

CITIZENSHIP CLUB makes a return this month, led by Mrs Fry. Children have volunteered themselves to attend this club and we can't wait to see how this year goes, due to how much the children enjoyed themselves last year. On the 9 November the children will visit the local Coastguard. They will see a great view from the watchtower, hear about the work that the coastguard does and more! If your child has secured a place in this club, Mrs Fry will share a reminder/updates ahead of each Thursday's activities.

**COLD AND WET WEATHER** sees children needing a coat. Please ensure that you send your child to school wearing their hooded coat please. At drizzly break-times we still like children to have some time outside and without a coat this is problematic. Wellies are encouraged too, in order that the children can continue using the field and Den Pens - each class has a welly rack to store wellies. Please name your wellies!

**COUGHS and COLDS** A further reminder. In the coming months, there may be further seasonal illnesses. Please note school Calpol is for school-based incidents. Should your child need Calpol for pain relief, please ensure you have it given to them before the start of school and have sent it in with them (named and with related consent given to the office) in the event they require it being readministered during the school day. Schools do not have the resources to provide Calpol for known illnesses. Please also send your child to school with a **packet of tissues** to help with their runny noses or sneezes. Sometimes it is hard to know what to do when your child is possibly ill, so the following information might prove helpful when judging if your child is well enough to attend school:

- **Coughs and colds:** It's fine to send your child to school with a minor <u>cough</u> or <u>common cold</u>. But if they have a fever, keep them off school until the fever goes. Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly.
- **Covid**: If your child has mild symptoms, such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, and feels well enough, they can go to school. However, if they have the following:
- a high temperature
- do not feel well enough to be able to get school or do their normal activities when they get there, then try and keep them at home until they feel better. Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly.

**Vomiting and diarrhoea:** Children with <u>diarrhoea or vomiting</u> should stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours). For further information and guidance on common childhood illnesses please <u>click</u> here to access the NHS website.

**END OF TERM** report cards will be shared in the week beginning 4 December. In previous years we have shared these earlier, however we have decided that they will be more informative to you after the children have had two half terms in their current year group. You will have an opportunity to discuss these with teachers during the online learning reviews referenced below, in the same week.

**EPI-PENS** for those children who require them, please ensure they are in school and in date. Previously, we were able to obtain these for emergency school use but these are now hard to obtain and we no longer have them.

**FACEBOOK** continues to capture our daily blog. Please interact with our posts by 'liking' or commenting on them. Additionally, we do have our 'secret' parent/carer Facebook page which gives you the opportunity to ask questions 'out of hours' to one another. The school 'own' the page but please do not ask questions you are aiming directly of the school - for something only the school can answer or needs brining to their attention, please communicate with the school office or your child's teacher.

FIREWORK SPECTACULAR is planned at Gomer Junior School on Thursday 2 November - thank you and the community for your support with this; tickets are nearly sold out! We are hoping we are able to go ahead (await confirmation from the company) so please be set with your tickets, a smile, 'glo', waterproofs and some layers. All food will be served in the hall and we are likely to all be viewing from the blue playground to help keep our feet dry and protect the field. Regardless of the weather, the display is always rather awesome. Prior to the event children will be discussing the importance of firework safety. Have your tea with us at the event where we will be selling hot dogs, chips, donuts, and hot and cold drinks from the servery inside the hall. To reduce waste, please feel free to bring your own hot drinks cup. Please be aware - the fireworks are loud, so younger viewers may wish to wear ear defenders and thick woolly hats. Additionally, alcohol and sparklers are not allowed on the school site. With thanks to Big Team Gomer (some Big Team Rowner too) for giving their evening to marshal the event. With thanks to the FROGJS and POGOS for sorting the refreshments for us.

FROGJS have been busy. The Spooky Disco, held on 19 October was a great success; dancing, costumes, games, tattoos and snacks were enjoyed by all who attended! FIREWORKS are scheduled for Thursday 2 November. Gates open at 5.30pm via the Gomer Infant red pedestrian gate. There are a few tickets still available for this event from the infant school gazebo. GLOW BEFORE YOU GO will be available to buy on Tuesday 31 October and Wednesday 1 November immediately after school in the infant school gazebo/playground. Please come along to stock up on this year's glowy items from our POGOS and FROGJS ready for the autumnal dark nights and firework show season. There has been much work behind the scenes and we can't wait for this fabulous annual event. The CHRISTMAS FAYRE, scheduled for Friday 1 December, is set to be another wonderful community event. FROGJS are currently planning this with school staff. A reminder that children are invited to wear non-uniform/festive jumpers on that Friday in exchange for tombola items e.g. chocolates, tins of biscuits, sweets, jars, snacks and treats. We are not doing a bottle stall and alcoholic items can't go on the tombola, as we wouldn't be able to give them to unaccompanied children. Prizes for the raffle and homemade or shop bought cakes will also be gratefully received (cakes on the day of the fayre). Might you own a business and be able to provide a raffle prize and/or know someone who would? This would be an awesome way to support the FROGJS and your school. Timings and arrangements for the day are as follows:

- 2.30-3.10pm Pupils only can access the fayre during this time if they wish to do so. This provides every child the opportunity to attend the fayre and enables the school to dismiss the children at the end of the day safely, so that children can be reunited with their adult from their classroom. If spending, please ensure pupils have their money in a named purse or envelope. Please note, there will be a Calm Zone in place for those pupils who do not wish to take part. Toasties and hot dogs will be available for £1, cakes for 50p alongside a selection of 'pocket money' stalls, so change will be appreciated. Raffle tickets will also be available during this time.
- **3.10pm** <u>Pupils</u> will be dismissed from their classroom door as normal. Please meet them as you normally would. If they are attending the fayre after the school day they can only do so if they are chaperoned by a parent/carer.

- **3.15pm ALL WELCOME** to school for the fayre which can be accessed via the hall door. Stalls will be in the hall, and also in lower school classrooms, and the large year 5 classroom beside the library. The raffle will be held in the hall and tickets can be purchased on the day, if you have not done so beforehand.
- GClub will operate as normal. If children attending want to attend the fayre for longer, Miss Kimber will endeavour to arrange a chaperone for them after 3:15pm.
- 3.50pm classroom stalls start to close. Please either leave the site or make your way to the hall for the raffle.
- **4.00pm** Please make your way to the hall where the raffle will be called. Please send in requests for your tickets ahead of the fayre to save time. You are however welcome to buy more on the day. You may also like to continue to buy some food and sweet treats from the hall to keep you nourished during the raffle.
- 4.15pm Fayre closes after the raffle so please make your way offsite, avoiding the gym and play-trails.

We look forward to seeing you here. We have stalls which require volunteers – please help if you can. In anticipation of your continued support, thank you for supporting your school.

**GCLUB** is our awesome breakfast and after-school childcare club. Ms Kimber, our current GClub Leader is soon to become a Learning Mentor so she will be handing over the leadership of GClub to Mrs Case, who some of you may recognise from Woodpeckers. We are very pleased that she will be joining Team Gomer on Monday 6 November.

GOOGLE CLASSROOM is a wonderful platform for pupil interaction with learning and guiding their learning too. We started using it in 2019 and it was an incredibly useful tool for Home Learning during the lockdown periods. Polite reminder: the Google Classroom platform is for pupils to log-in with their allocated password to access school resources during the day and for Home Learning after the school day. We encourage parents/carers to check the children's 'to do' lists to support their interactions whilst they are using it at home. Please refrain from interacting with your child's Google Classroom during the day and asking questions, to the teacher, in your child's name, about resources - this is not a reasonable way to interact with the classroom and any future comments will need to be deleted due to safeguarding protocols. **GROUNDFORCE DAY AUTUMN 2023** has been set for Tuesday 07 November 2023. We love gardening at Gomer. So, the whole school will be participating in a range of gardening, landscaping and outdoor learning opportunities, at different times during the day. Adult support with helping with the grounds, independently or alongside your child, will be very much appreciated between **09:30-12:00**. Adults will be working outside and can work with other adults or their child. Please bring some tools with you to help - secateurs, rakes, spades etc would be really useful as we have a limited supply (we suggest they are named). On the day, all children are to come to school in clothes you do not mind getting dirty and should bring their wellies or suitable outdoor shoes. Please ensure Y4 and Y6 have trainers so PE can still be an option without the need for changing. Donations of good quality plants or bulbs would be very much appreciated. Please complete this <u>Google form</u> if you are available to help on the day.

**INCLUSION drop in sessions** will begin again on Wednesday 6 December at the Community Hub located at Brune Park School for an hour between 4pm - 5pm. These are free for any parent/carer to attend and are an opportunity for you to discuss any ongoing concerns/needs of your child, in an informal forum. Present will be all the GFM SEND Leaders and some staff from the Inclusion teams. In this session we will be supported by a keynote speaker from the Mental Health Support Team and this first session will have a focus on supporting anxiety, attachment and avoidance in our young people. Parking is free on site at Brune Park and refreshments will be provided. No booking required.

**READING** is so, so important. Please, please ensure your child is reading regularly and where appropriate, to you. We have systems in place to encourage children to choose a variety of genres in addition to their banded book.

**REMEMBRANCE** Ahead of our Remembrance day gathering the children will be creating a display in their classrooms and considering the symbolism of the Poppy. We are delighted to be supporting the Royal British Legion again this year. The Armed Forces conduct their role with courage and humility and often play down the sacrifice and bravery required to serve. The Royal British Legion is here to help members of the Royal Navy, British Army, Royal Air Force, veterans and their families. They support serving and ex-serving personnel all year round, every day of the week. Your donations, for items for those who wish to, will help them continue their work. Children are welcome to wear the RBL items with the school uniform from Tuesday 31 October - Friday 10 November when we will be having our whole school remembrance gathering. With thanks to our Service Children who will be helping Miss Hall sell the items on behalf of the RBL. Poppies and other Royal British Legion poppy themed items will be on sale immediately after the half term break, should your child wish to purchase. These include poppy appeal bracelets for £1.50, snap bands, zip pulls, rulers and wristbands for £1, pencils, crayons, reflective poppies for 50p and traditional poppies for a minimum 50p donation. We have a few handmade poppy hair bobbles which cost £2.

**SCHOOL UNIFORM** should now be of the winter variety until the Summer Term 2024 - so please pack away the summer dresses and shorts. Thank you for your support with this. With the darker days ahead of us, we also encourage children to have an item of 'reflective glow' attached to their bag or coat if not already attached, to ensure they are visible when walking to school and home again. Additionally, bicycle lights should be considered for all children.

THE WIZARD OF OZ on ice is being performed at our local ice-skating rink on Wednesday 29 November. With many thanks to Huhtamaki for their £1000 donation and FROGJS and FOR (Friends of Rowner), who have also donated considerably, for enabling us to make this event possible. We have been able to book all of the seats in the rink, in order that all children from Gomer and Rowner Junior can attend: a huge thank-you to all for making this pre-Christmas treat possible. We thought this would be a wonderful alternative to a pantomime which we all attended last year. On the day, children are to attend school as normal in their school uniform. They will have lunch at school and will be transported to the ice-rink by coach. The coach will then return to school around 3:40pm where they will be dismissed - we will update any significant changes in time via text on the day. Due to our return being after the school day, if you need to collect your child directly from the ice rink at 3.05pm, please inform the school office. For children returning home in a taxi. please have their taxi collection time rescheduled. If this is problematic, please arrange their collection from the Ice Rink at their normal GJS pick-up time. To help the school manage the logistics, the only school club that will operate is GClub.

WELLIES (or stout shoes) are very much welcomed in school if they are clearly named/identifiable. Wellies will be stored

on the racks outside during the day but stowed inside overnight. When the field is not too saturated in the wetter and wintry months, children with wellies will be able to play on the field. You may also like to send your child to school with a coat you don't mind getting a little muddy, if you have a child who is enjoying our 'mud kitchen'.

YOU SAID/WE DID We know some of you missed having text reminders. We stopped sending multiple text reminders about 18 months ago due to feedback that too many were being sent. To help keep text costs low, we are limiting the amount we send but will be sending a mid-month reminder email of activities and events, referenced on our start of month email. We had feedback that this bitesize communication was very helpful with supporting busy family lives. We are aware our newsletters are quite lengthy but knowing you value the detail we will continue with sharing these.
