ARRIVAL AT & PICK UP AFTER SCHOOL For health and safety reasons children should not be on the school playground before 8.40am. We have recently had several children arriving at the school site too early. Unaccompanied children who are on site too early will be sent to GClub, which will incur a cost. Staff are on duty each morning at 8.40 am. Even if chaperoned, please avoid arriving too early as our GClubbers might be using the playground. Additionally, some parents/carers have been arriving well ahead of the end of the day. It can be unsettling to children to see adults walking around the site or standing outside classrooms. For safeguarding reasons, please do not access the school site before 3.05pm. If you do, please wait on Pyrford Close or Bury Hall Lane. Parents/carers who arrive on-site ahead of this time will be asked to relocate off-site.

BIG BOOKY BAKE OFF will be held on **World Book Day 7 March**. We are very excited about this as it is a new World Book Day activity for us! We are pleased with the pace of the progress being made and feel that we are currently on track to achieve the DfE's planned target date for officially joining the King's Group in April 2024. MOMENTS MATTER/ATTENDANCE COUNTS



We wanted to remind you about the government's recent campaign on attendance, titled <u>'Moments Matter</u>, <u>Attendance Counts</u>.' Launched in January 2024, and referenced on our website and FaceBook page, this campaign highlights the significance of attendance for learners' attainment, wellbeing, and overall growth. It also provides valuable advice and support for parents and caregivers. We believe that this campaign aligns with our school's values and practices regarding attendance.

At our school, we have always closely monitored the attendance of every child. Each learner's attendance contributes to their overall attendance mark, which we review on a monthly basis. As part of our ongoing efforts to promote attendance awareness, we have been sending letters to families whose children have an overall attendance rate less than 90%. Since the launch of the government campaign, we have needed to extend this practice to include learners with an overall attendance between 90% and 95%. This additional letter is simply a notification to inform parents or caregivers that their child is nearing the 90% threshold. We want to ensure that everyone is aware of the importance of regular attendance at school. It is worth noting that any attendance below 90% is considered persistent absenteeism. The table below also highlights how absence from school impacts on the overall school attendance figure. You will have seen, in the news recently, the Government's national drive to improve school attendance.

100%	0 days off school
97%	5 days off across the school year
95%	10 days off across the school year
90%	20 days off across the school year
85%	30 days off across the school year

Improving school attendance is everyone's business and, to tackle the challenge we face, we need to work together. If you would like to speak to a member of staff about your child's attendance then please contact Ms Sewell or Mrs Wilden.

MEDICINES Please note the school holds Calpol 6+ for **emergency use only** and is held for use in exceptional circumstances. If you feel your child may need medication during the school day, please complete a medicine consent form and bring the medicine into the school office clearly named. Please note, If the school is unable to manage prescribed medication, you may be required to administer this for your child. Please remember to collect medicines you will need over the Easter break before Thursday 28 March.

MOBILE PHONES have recently been discussed by the government and guidance provided. At our school, for those who have them, phones are welcome in school if they are tucked away safely upon arrival to school and do not come out of bags until children are off the school site. Unless children are walking home solo, we recommend that children leave mobile phones at home. Please remind your child that phones are not to be used on the school site unless they have the

permission of an adult e.g. they may need to call home at the end of the day to check an arrangement. Please also note that any such device brought into school is done so at the owner's risk - the school is unable to take responsibility for devices.

NON-UNIFORM DAY on **Wednesday 27 March** will be in support of the Charity<u>Simon Says</u>. They support Hampshire young people up to the age of 18 years who have a significant person in their life who has died or is dying. We aim to support one charity a term and therefore ask for donations of £1 per child. If children do not want to participate they are very welcome to wear their school uniform - and still make a donation or not. We support charities to help raise awareness and valuable funds. Society and governments aren't set up to protect everyone who needs it. That's why charities are here to fill the gaps and provide dedicated resources to help the most vulnerable. Volunteers from Simon Says will be in from 14:00 to deliver an assembly to our Year 6 children (Year 5 and lower school students will be doing their assembly with class teachers.) If you would like to find out more about the work of this local charity, the volunteers from Simon Says will be in The Globe from 14:30 - 15:30 for you to drop in and answer any questions you may have. They will also be happy to offer any guidance or be able to talk about the support available. They are more than happy for you to pop in with your children between 15:10 and 15:30 should you wish to drop in together.



OUTDOOR LEARNING/GROUND FORCE DAY We are hosting two 'Ground Force Days' this year. Our first is - **Tuesday 16 April**. The whole school will be participating in a range of gardening, landscaping and outdoor learning opportunities, at different times, throughout the day. Adult support with helping with the grounds, independently or alongside your child will be very much appreciated. Adults will be working outside and can work with other adults or their child. Please bring some tools with you to help - secateurs, rakes, spades etc would be really useful as we have a limited supply (make sure they are named). Donations of good quality plants would be very much appreciated. Please complete this <u>Google Form</u> to commit to helping on the day. Children are to come to school in clothes you do not mind getting grubby or paint on and should bring their wellies or suitable outdoor shoes. Please ensure Y3 and Y5 have trainers so PE can still be an option without the need for changing.

SECONDARY SCHOOL places for Y7 September 2024 will be announced on Friday 01 March. If you apply online, you will be sent an email confirming the outcome of your application on the notification date. You can also log into the online system to view the outcome. If you applied using a paper form, you will be sent a letter on the notification date by post. Please allow 2 to 3 working days for your letter to arrive. There is no need for you to accept the place offered to your child at any Hampshire school. However, please let HCC know in writing if you no longer need the place so that it can be offered to another child. If you have not been offered a place at your preferred school, your child will be added to the waiting list. You also have a right to appeal against the refusal. The GFM transition will be comprehensive and we have already been working with our secondary colleagues on transition matters.

SPECIAL LADY LUNCH is scheduled for **Monday 4 March.** We host this so that children can share lunch with that 'special lady' in their life – mother, carer, grandparent, godmother, auntie, family friend etc. We hope to see many 'special ladies' joining us for lunch again this year. With thanks to all the special ladies who have already RSVP. A reminder to make payment of £2.80 if you have ordered an adult meal for this event. Payment for the adult meal can be made online on SCOPAY under PRODUCTS. Alternatively, the Special Lady can bring a packed lunch. Children's meals can be ordered on the day as usual and paid for online or they may bring a packed lunch.

A reminder of the menu is as follows:-

To accommodate our special visitors, we will have staggered lunch sittings as follows:-

On arrival to school, Special Ladies should make their way to the school hall via the entrance by the blue playground (5 minutes ahead of your child's sitting, no earlier) to be signed-in and seated ahead of your child joining you. Special Ladies will be required to wear a visitor sticker and asked to hand this in when leaving, so the school can account for extra adults being on and then off site. Once you and your child have eaten, you are encouraged to stay and play outside if the weather is fine and you have time. If we experience a wet play, we may have to ask Special Ladies to leave after you have eaten due to limited space inside the school.

STUBBINGTON STUDY CENTRE - OPEN DAY Saturday 16 March, 10.00-4.00pm. This is an opportunity for Year 5 children and their families to look around, talk to the staff and alleviate any concerns they might have about attending the centre before their residential visit. As a result, this could help your child to get the most from their trip in July. There is no need to prebook to attend this open day.

SUMMER UNIFORM is welcome in the Summer Term - after the Easter holiday. Local supermarkets already have dark blue items in stock but you may like to double check our uniform list before you purchase. In the Summer Term **DARK BLUE gingham** dresses or playsuits are allowed. Pale blue items are not welcomed because these **are not** on our uniform list. The Summer school uniform list also stipulates that formal grey or black shorts, skirts, shorts or culottes can be worn, with short sleeved white shirt, blouse or polo. Gingham blouses **are not** part of our uniform list. Children wanting to wear sandals in hotter weather must do so only when also wearing socks - this is for health and safety reasons. PE uniform continues to be our blue PE tops and unbranded **black** shorts or sport trousers with trainers.

STAFF MATTER Since half-term, Mrs Miles-Williams has been full-time at GClub. We are delighted that she has joined Team Gomer and is now with the children for breakfast and after school.

SWIMMING is an invaluable life skill and a compulsory part of the National Curriculum with class 4LW starting their sessions after the Easter break, Tuesday 16 April. We are lucky enough to have access to the Brune Park swimming pool and have specialist swimming instructors to lead the sessions. Each Year 4 child will participate in six sessions. They will receive tailored group lessons based on their ability. Please ensure you have completed this <u>Google Form</u>, to help us initially group the children based on their current ability. Please ensure the children have their swim kits (one piece for girls) in school on a Tuesday and a small snack and drink for after. The Easter break is an ideal opportunity to get organised with swim kits! Additionally, if your child is not water confident, the Easter Holiday is an ideal opportunity to make use of your local leisure facilities. Brune Park has family swim sessions which you may like to check out.
